 - Introductory and Basic Award – Highest score for Intro and Basic Freestyle Classes
 - Level 1 through Level 6 Award – Highest score for Level 1 through Level 6 Freestyle Classes

- **Breed High Points**

- Breed high point ribbons will be awarded if sponsored. A list of sponsored breeds will be published on show webpage. **Riders MUST be members of WDAFL to qualify for Breed High Point awards.** Breed registration papers must be submitted to show office prior to the start of the show. Horses without submitted papers will be placed in the Grade category. **You may only declare one breed registration per horse/rider.**

- **WDAFL Versatility Award – new for 2027**

The WDAFL Versatility Award recognizes the horse-and-rider combination that demonstrates excellence across multiple areas of Western Dressage competition.

To be eligible, the same horse-and-rider combination must compete in:

- At least one rail class
- One Freestyle class
- A Western Dressage Test 3 or Test 4 on Saturday

The final Versatility Award score will be calculated using:

1. The combination of the horse/rider team's Freestyle score and highest Test 3 or Test 4 score plus
2. Points earned for **each rail class** in which the combination competes, based on placing:
 - 1st Place – 6 points
 - 2nd Place – 5 points
 - 3rd Place – 4 points
 - 4th Place – 3 points
 - 5th Place – 2 points
 - 6th Place – 1 point

Only placings from first through sixth will earn rail-class points. Points earned in all eligible rail classes will be added to the combination's Freestyle and test score.

The horse-and-rider combination with the highest final score will be named the WDAFL Versatility Award winner. The winner will be announced during the Saturday evening Awards Banquet.

AQHA Western Dressage Program

This show will be recognized by the AQHA. Scores will be reported to AQHA for those who declare their AQHA membership, provide horse registration number and pay the \$30 fee.

WDAA Horse Lifetime Performance & Award Program (WHL PAP)

WDAA supports a Lifetime Performance & Award Program. This is a point-tracking system awarding cumulative milestone achievements to horses competing in Western Dressage. Enrolled horses earn points by competing in tests and rail classes at WDAA recognized shows. The WDAA offers a Year-End High Point Program (YEHP), not a traditional "award program" in the sense of specific awards given to members at year-end. The YEHP is a free program that tracks a horse's performance throughout the season at [WDAA Recognized Shows](#), with recognition on the WDAA website and a certificate for achievements in Western Dressage. To participate, you must be a WDAA member and earn points at recognized shows for your horse and rider combination.

Competition Rules

Memberships and Horse Registrations

- **USEF Membership:** This is a USEF show. All horses competing in Federation licensed competitions must be properly identified.
 1. **New for 2027 – All horses MUST have a USEF horse identification number and a microchip – For a free USEF horse ID visit.** <https://www.usef.org/join-usef/join-renew>, join as a **USEF Fan Member**, once you have your USEF Fan member number, you can then sign up for your **USEF Horse ID**.
 2. A WDAA horse registration number –To sign up for a FREE WDAA horse number please visit <https://wdaalifetimepoints.org/wdaa-horse-number-registration/> If you already have a WDAA Horse Lifetime Points and Awards Program (WHL PAP) horse number, that will be your WDAA horse number.
 3. The horse's breed registration number (if competing for a breed award).
- **USEF membership is required for all competitors signing as trainer or coach. Additionally, USEF Safe Sport training must be current in order to be allowed to compete in any capacity.**
- **Amateur Status:** If you are entering amateur classes, you will need to provide proof of amateur status with your entry. If you do not provide proof of amateur status, you will be placed in the open division. **Because this is a USEF recognized show, the only acceptable proof of amateur status is a USEF Amateur card or EC Amateur card.** Please see <http://www.usef.org> for more information on obtaining an amateur card. GR 1306 and GR 1307. J
- Any competitor who has a current USEF membership MUST be current on safe sport training.
- **WDAA Memberships:** All owners, trainers and riders competing **MUST be a member of WDAA.** **You may join WDAA at www.westerndressageassociation.org.** You may learn more about the WDAA Horse Lifetime Points and Awards Program (WHL PAP) and about membership at www.westerndressageassociation.org. As a USEF show, this show is eligible for DOUBLE WHL PAP points.
- **AQHA Memberships:** Those with AQHA membership who wish to qualify for AQHA awards are responsible for proper registration with AQHA to be able to earn points at this show.

Entries

- **Deadline:** Entries must be received by the closing date which is January 1, 2027. Make checks payable to **WDAFL** and send entry to Stacia Wert Gray, show secretary. Credit cards through <https://www.horseshowoffice.com/> or paypal at info@wdafl.org
- **Online entry** address is <https://horseshowoffice.com>
- **Every horse/rider team requires a separate entry.** Entry must be complete before receiving packet.
- Please provide and USEF and WDAA documents for rider, owner, trainer and horse as appropriate for entry/classes. Entries will not be processed without full payment
- **Please check in at the show office prior to schooling.**
- **Multiple Riders:** Horses may be ridden by no more than two riders and may only be ridden at consecutive levels regardless of the rider. A horse may not be entered in the same class even if ridden by a different rider.
- **Priority and Waitlists:** Entries are accepted as received by secretary. Entries may be limited. Entries arriving after closing will be accepted at the discretion of the show secretary as space allows. If the classes are oversubscribed, a "wait list" will be maintained. Horses will be moved into the show based on wait list order prior to schedule. After the show has been timed, show secretary will work wait list horses into the show. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry

- **Musical freestyle** sound check is at the first break of the show day or at a time arranged with show management. **No CDs. Please email an mp4 format to gtgray@aol.com.**
- **Horses Not Competing:** Non-showing horses are allowed on the grounds if space is available. The owner must fill out an entry form and pay office, stall, and non-competing horse fees, but no USEF drug fee.
- **Bridle Numbers:** Horses (competing & non-competing) should wear show numbers when out of stall.

Health requirements

- Horses traveling from out of state are required to have a 30 day Health certificate.
- All entries must include proof of negative Coggins test within 12 months of show date.
- Equine Vaccination Rule GR844: At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within 6 months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management.
- Drug Testing: All exhibitors are required to pay the USEF Drug & Medication fee of \$25 and are subject to being randomly drug tested at the competition. (For USEF shows only)

Class and Level Restrictions:

- Horses may be ridden by a maximum of 2 riders. Each horse/rider combination requires a separate entry with all signatures and emergency contact. (WD 102)
- No horse may be ridden in the same class number more than once (even with a different rider) per (WD 102.2)
- Horses may only compete in levels that are adjacent even with a different rider.
- Horses who have shown in Western Hack are no longer eligible for Western Suitability.
- Horse/rider combinations showing in walk/jog rail classes are not eligible for other rail classes or any test other than Introductory Level (Different horse/rider combinations are eligible for other rail classes and tests)
- Horses may not compete in more than 4 tests per day.
- To be eligible for Intro Level, a horse/rider combination must not have shown in a Western Dressage test at Level 1 or above in the same competition year. (WD 130.1)
- If a rider competes in Walk-Jog Western Dressage Seat Equitation on the Rail, they are prohibited from competing in any class involving a lope at the same competition. (WD 144.2)
- Horse-rider combinations competing in walk jog events are not eligible to compete at levels that include the lope and horses competing in lope classes are not eligible to compete in Intro Freestyle at the same competition (WD 131)
- If entering advanced walk jog, the horse cannot be entered in any class that has a lope at the same competition.
- Current WDAA/USEF tests are available at www.westerndressageassociation.org.

Leadline Class:

The Lead Line Class will be held on Saturday during the lunch break. The exact time will be listed on the Ride Times Sheet and announced at the show.

The class is open to riders ages 2–10. Helmets are required. Each rider may be led by a parent, guardian, or groom who is at least 18 years old. Horses must wear a bridle and be led with a halter and lead rope. Ribbons will be awarded in the arena at the end of the class.

Attire and Equipment

USEF rules and guidelines will be used for attire and equipment. For more information, please visit

- **Required Attire:**
 - Suitable western hat. Protective headgear may be worn without penalty (See GR801) and is STRONGLY recommended.
 - Long-sleeved shirt with any type of collar: short sleeves may be worn at the judge's discretion
 - Trousers, pants, a one-piece long sleeved equitation suit provided it includes a collar.
 - Boots with distinguishable heel.
- **Optional Attire:**
 - Necktie, kerchief, bolo tie or pin.
 - A vest, jacket, coat and/or sweater.
 - Spurs. Western style, with or without blunt tines, English dressage style, roller ball, and blunt bumper spurs are permitted. Rowels must be vertical. Spurs with sharp tines are not permitted.
 - Chaps, shotgun chaps, chinks, armitas, or split riding skirt.
 - Protective headgear is acceptable; not required to be of Western style. BOD 6/28/21 Effective 12/1/21

Scheduling

- Management reserves the right to change officials, limit entries, combine or cancel classes, and modify the schedule to make any changes required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein.
- Show management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by Show Management
- Musical freestyle sound check will be at 1 pm on Friday unless competitor makes an alternate arrangement with show management.

Official Ride Times

- **Provisional Ride Times:** Stabling assignments and provisional ride times will be available on www.horseshowconsulting.com/ about one week prior to the show. They will be emailed as well.
- **Day Sheet:** Be certain to check the day sheet which will be posted by noon the day before the show. It will reflect any last minute scheduling changes. The day sheet will be posted in the show office. The day sheet is the "Official Show Times" document.

Scores

- Tests will be scored electronically. If an email is provided scores will be emailed. Additionally, you may check your score at www.horseshowconsulting.com. Scores will be posted in show office within 15 minutes of the completion of your ride. Pick up tests in the show office.
- It is the responsibility of the competitor to verify the accuracy of all scores.
- Scoring errors must be reported to the Show Secretary within one hour of the official posting of the scores from the last class of the show day during which the score was earned.
- Class ties will not be broken.

- Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USEF) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

Miscellaneous

- **Dogs:** Dogs are allowed on the grounds but must be on a 6 foot or shorter leash or restrained at all times. They are not allowed near the show ring or warm-up ring. They must be quiet and mannerly. The Florida Horse Park will levy a \$50 fine for any unleashed dog.
- **Sharps Containers:** Competition management shall place at least one sharps container in each stabling area for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. If local law has different requirements, local law prevails.
- **Other:** Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules and of the current rulebook will be judged in accordance therewith.
- **Media Release Agreement** I agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, or other likenesses of me and/or my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion or benefit of the competition or sport. These likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in any way to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or misappropriation

Facility Information

Stabling

- **Stabling:** stalls and tack stalls will be assigned on a “first come, first serve” basis by receipt of entry. Stalls are quality permanent (12 x 12) with full sliding doors and solid floors. Please preorder bedding on the entry form. **Shavings are NOT included with stall purchase.** All electric plugs and fans must have the proper “grounded plug”.
- **Shavings:** Shavings are available for purchase through the show office prior to the show or during the show for \$10/bag. Please, no straw bedding.
- **Availability:** Stalls are available from noon the day prior to the show until 9 pm on show day unless paying for early arrival/late departure (\$50/night/stall)
- **Tack:** Tack stalls are available
- **Groups:** For accurate stall assignments, please include your stabling group preferences when submitting your entry.

Arenas

- **Arenas:** Two dressage courts will be set up in a 375' x 212' covered arena with an improved clay/sand mixture. Warmup is under the covered arena in the designated warmup area or in the outdoor grass area. Introductory and basic classes will be in a small ring 20x40. All other classes will be in a 20x60. All freestyles (including introductory and basic) will be in the 20x60 arena.
- **Schooling**
 - Horses may work in the warm-up and show arenas but lights out at 9:30 pm.
 - Hand walking around the outside of the show arena on show day is permitted at designated times.
 - Lunging is available in outdoor arena only.

Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

USEF Rules

Beginning December 1, 2026, under GR 1101.10, all horses competing in USEF-licensed or -endorsed competitions must be microchipped with a 15-digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip.

A **TRAINER**, as listed on the entry form, is defined as any adult (18 & older) who has responsibility for the care, custody or performance of the horse while the horse is on the competition grounds. This adult must sign the entry form as trainer. If the rider is considered the trainer, the rider must sign as the trainer. A parent or guardian signing on behalf of a junior exhibitor **must** be a USEF member. A **COACH**, as listed on the entry form, is defined as an adult (18 & older) who is paid or unpaid for instructing, teaching, schooling or advising a rider with their horse on the competition grounds. This adult must sign the entry form as coach. If there is no coach, the signature for coach may be left blank.

Membership/Non-Member/Proof of Membership fees (EFFECTIVE 12/1/2022)

All ACTIVE USEF members who are participants (rider, owner, trainer, agent, lessee, or coach) must provide to the competition secretary a current USEF membership number. In the event a rider or owner does not have his/her membership number, he/she must pay a \$45 USEF show pass fee. Riders and owners are only eligible for one show pass fee per competition year. Show pass purchases can only be made online through USEF by the rider or owner. Trainers and coaches, including parents signing an entry blank or acting as a trainer or coach, must be an Active USEF member and are NOT eligible to participate under a show pass and must be active USEF members.

Motorized Vehicle Rule: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt.

USEF SafeSport Training Requirements To Compete Effective January 1, 2019, every USEF adult member (18 & older) with an active senior competing membership must complete USEF's Safe Sport Training, overseen by the U.S. Center for SafeSport. An adult member may be OWNER, RIDER, TRAINER and/or COACH. Adult members listed on the entry must complete the entire course and be Safe Sport Trained before the first day of competition. Safe Sport Training must be completed by all adult members on the entry or the rider will not be allowed to compete. You may access the Safe Sport modules from your USEF member dashboard at www.USEF.org.

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers ("Risks").

C. 9. Arenas (including grass, fiber and covered) are not to be used unless scheduled in advance and approved.

11. The Florida Horse Park reserves the right to remove dangerous, disruptive or unlawful persons from the property.
12. Absolutely NO LUNGING IN THE COVERED ARENA, FIBER ARENAS OR GRASS ARENAS. The small sand arenas northeast of the covered arena is designated for lunging.
13. Open campfires are not permitted. Fires should be in contained fire rings.
