WDAA Horse Lifetime Performance & Award Program (WHLPAP)

WDAA supports a Lifetime Performance & Award Program. This is a point-tracking system awarding cumulative milestone achievements to horses competing in Western Dressage. Enrolled horses earn points by competing in tests and rail classes at WDAA recognized shows. Class placings and percentages are converted to a point system, which follows the horse as they travel up the levels on their journey. It's all about the Journey - from your first show, to your WDAA Register of Merit, to WDAA Supreme Champion. AQHA Western Dressage Program

This show is recognized by the AQHA, and scores will be reported with payment to AQHA for those who declare and provide AQHA membership and horse recognition number and \$25 payment. Note that Introductory level classes are not recognized by AQHA and that Level 5 has not yet been added to the AQHA awards program.

Competition Rules

Memberships

- **USEF Rider/Owner/Trainer/Coach Membership:** This is a USEF lite show. **NO USEF memberships, or non-member fees are required to compete in this show except for the person signing as trainer who MUST be a USEF competing member and current on Safe Sport training. If showing in the Adult Amateur division, you must have a current USEF amateur card and be safe sport compliant.**
- Shows is eligible for ½ USEF pts. Please provide your USEF number if you are a member to earn USEF points.
- **Horse Registration:** Beginning 12/1/25, all horses competing in USEF licensed competitions must have at a minimum, a USEF Horse ID number. The Horse ID number is available free of charge through USEF Click here for registration information: <https://members.usef.org/horses/add>
 - It is suggested that you apply for this Horse ID# on or before the date you enter the show.
 - If not a USEF member, you can apply for a Fan Membership (free of charge) and then you can apply for a (Free) Horse ID and register your horse's microchip number.
- **WDAA Memberships:** All owners and riders competing to qualify for WDAA lifetime points **MUST be a member of WDAA** to be eligible for WDAA lifetime points program. You may learn more about the lifetime points program and about membership at www.westerndressageassociation.org. As a USEF “Lite” show, this show is eligible for DOUBLE WDAA lifetime points. New for 2025, WDAA is offering a 2025 Year End High Point program. - **AQHA Memberships:** Those with AQHA membership who wish to qualify for AQHA awards are responsible for proper registration with AQHA to be able to earn points at this show. The show will submit \$25.00 to AQHA for each AQHA member; this is a required processing fee per AQHA horse/rider combination

Entries

- **Negative Coggins (within the 12 months of the show date) and vaccination record (Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus “Rhinopneumonitis” within 6 months of show date)** are required to be submitted with entry or shown prior to unloading on show grounds.
- **Deadline:** Entries must be received by the closing date. Make checks payable to **Kansas Dressage and Eventing Association** and send entry to Stacia Wert Gray, **entry** secretary. Credit cards through <https://www.horseshowoffice.com/> or paypal at kdeamain@gmail.com
- **Online entry** address is <https://horseshowoffice.com/#/>
- **Every horse/rider team requires a separate entry.** Entry must be complete before receiving packet.
- **Riders MUST check in at the show office prior to schooling.**
- **Multiple Riders:** Horses may be ridden by multiple riders and may be ridden at different levels, but a horse may not be entered in the same class even if ridden by a different rider.
- **Priority and Waitlists:** Entries are accepted as received by secretary. Entries may be limited. Entries arriving after closing will be accepted at the discretion of the show secretary as space allows. If the classes are oversubscribed, a “wait list” will be maintained. Horses will be moved into the show based on wait list order prior to schedule. After the show has been timed, show secretary will work wait list horses into the show based on the best fit. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry
- **Rider, owner USEF numbers are optional.** If you are competing for USEF year-end awards, please provide these numbers.
- **Horses Not Competing:** Non-showing horses are allowed on the grounds if space is available. The owner must fill out an entry form and pay office, stall, and non-competing horse fees. All tack and attire rules apply to non competing horses.
- **Bridle Numbers:** All horses (competing and non-competing) must wear show numbers when out of stall/away from trailer.

Tests and Level Restrictions

- **Maximum tests per horse:** Horses in this competition are limited to four tests per day.
- **Level restrictions –** Horses may only compete in levels that are adjacent **with the same rider**. For example, a horse may not be ridden in a basic level test and a level 2 test **unless** with a different rider.
- **Tests:** Current WDAA/USEF tests are available at www.westerndressageassociation.org. Check to make sure you have the most recent version of the test (dated 2022).

Attire and Equipment

USEF rules and guidelines will be used for attire and equipment. [Click here for the guide](#).

Note: Be sure to check the most recent version of this document a few weeks prior to the show date.

- **Required Attire:**
 - Suitable western hat. Protective headgear may be worn without penalty (See GR801) and is **STRONGLY recommended**.
 - Long-sleeved shirt with any type of collar: short sleeves may be worn at the discretion of the judge
 - Trousers, pants, a one-piece long sleeved equitation suit provided it includes a collar.
 - Boots with distinguishable heel.
- **Optional Attire:**
 - Necktie, kerchief, bolo tie or pin.
 - A vest, jacket, coat and/or sweater.

- Spurs. Western style, with or without blunt tines, English dressage style, roller ball, and blunt bumper spurs are permitted. Rowels must be vertical. Spurs with sharp tines are not permitted.
- Chaps, shotgun chaps, chinks, armitas, or split riding skirt.
- Protective headgear is acceptable; not required to be of Western style. BOD 6/28/21 Effective 12/1/21

Scheduling

- Management reserves the right to change officials, limit entries, combine or cancel classes, and modify the schedule to make any changes required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein.
- Show Management reserves the right to cancel classes insufficiently filled and to refuse or require withdrawal of an entry for cause deemed sufficient by Show Management
- Musical freestyle sound check will be late afternoon (exact time with ride times) on June 12

Official Ride Times

- **Provisional Ride Times:** Stabling assignments and provisional ride times will be available on www.horseshowconsulting.com/ about one week prior to the show. They will be emailed as well.
- **Day Sheet:** Be certain to check the day sheet which will be posted by noon the day before the show. It will reflect any last minute scheduling changes. The day sheet will be posted in the show office. The day sheet is the “Official Show Times” document.

Scores

- Tests will be scored in show office and scores will be posted on site. After the show, scores will be available on www.horseshowoffice.com.
- It is the responsibility of the competitor to verify the accuracy of all scores.
- Scoring errors must be reported to the Show Manager within one hour of the official posting of the scores from the last class of the show day during which the score was earned.
- Ties will not be broken.
- Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with correct applicable numbers (USEF/AQHA/WDAA) for horse, owner, rider, and trainer, before the day(s) of the competition. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards.

Facility Information

Stabling

- **Stalls:** Stalling is optional. 10X10 stalls, with doors, are available. Some stalls are on dirt (in “Red Barn” and some are on concrete (in newer stabling area). If you have a preference, please so state.
- **Shavings:** 2 bags of shavings provided with each stall. Additional shavings are available for purchase through the show office prior to the show or during the show for \$10/bag. Alternately, you may bring your own shavings. Please, no straw bedding.
- **Availability:** Stalls are available from 11 am the day prior to the show until 6pm on Sunday.
- **Tack:** Tack stalls are available for \$75.00 and do not include bedding. .
- **Groups:** Please note stalling groups with your entry. Show secretary is a lousy mind reader!

Arenas

- Footing: Indoor competition arena is dirt/sand mixture. Covered warmup is sand. There is a covered concrete walkway between the warmup and the competition arena.
- Arena Size: Small ring (20m x 40m) may be used for Introductory and Basic level tests. All other classes will be in the standard(20m x 60m) ring. All freestyles (including intro and basic level) will be in the 20m x 60m ring.
- Schooling: Horses may work in the warm-up and show arenas on Friday after 2 pm Riders MUST check in with the show office and obtain their number prior to schooling.
- Friday schooling closes at 9 pm; Saturday schooling closes at 7:30 pm
- Lights out at 11 pm Friday and Saturday night.
- Hand walking around the competition arena on show day is permitted at designated times. Lunging area will be marked as designated lunging; check with office.

Other

- **Dogs:** Dogs are allowed on the grounds but must be on a non-retractable leash or restrained at all times. They are not allowed near the show ring or warm-up ring. They must be quiet and mannerly. Show manager may ask dogs to be removed for cause.
- **Service animals** required because of a disability, who are trained to perform a task for the disabled person are allowed access to grounds.
- **Non-equine companion animals** are not allowed at facility (i.e. no goats, no pigs, etc)
- **Drones:** The use of drones, and flying of drones in/around show arenas and warmup arenas, is prohibited.
- **Rain Plan:** Competition ring is indoor and warmup is covered; there is a covered walkway between. In case of severe weather, show may go on “hold” until safe to resume. Return to competition will be handled per WD 129.5(g)
- **Sharps Containers:** Competition management shall place at least one sharps container in each stabling area for the disposal of needles and other disposable sharp instruments. Competition management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments. If local law has different requirements, local law prevails.
- **Manure Disposal.** There are manure disposal bins located throughout the stabling and ONLY manure and bedding is allowed in these bins. The facility charges \$100 for EACH bin found to have trash or other items in the manure disposal bins. Competitors may be charged this fee if this policy is not followed.
- **Other:** Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules and of the current rulebook will be judged in accordance therewith.

Special Event - Raffle and Silent Auction How Can You Participate?

Be sure to bring a few extra \$\$ with you to spend at the KDEA Raffle and Silent Auction. The idea is that for each \$1.00 donation, you get a ticket that you can place into the box in front of the raffle item that you would like to take home with you. 

(the "Federation") and the local rules of _____ (Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber, I acknowledge that I will be enrolled for no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew in USEF's sole discretion. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

For and in consideration of United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. dba US Equestrian ("USEF") allowing me, the undersigned, to participate in any capacity (including as a rider, driver, handler, vaulter, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, official, trainer or volunteer) in a USEF sanctioned, licensed or approved event or activity, including but not limited to equestrian clinics, practices, shows, competitions and related or incidental activities and

(“USEF Event” or “USEF Events”); I, for myself, and on behalf of my spouse, children, heirs and next of kin, and any legal and personal representatives, executors, administrators, successors, and assigns, hereby agree to and make the following contractual representations pursuant to this Agreement (the “Agreement”):

A. RULES AND REGULATIONS: I hereby agree that I have read, understand, and agree to be bound by all applicable Federation Bylaws, rules, and policies including the USEF Safe Sport Policy and Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies (MAAPP) as published at www.usef.org, as amended from time to time.

B. ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF RISK: I knowingly, willingly, and voluntarily acknowledge the inherent risks associated with the sport of equestrian and know that horseback riding and related equestrian activities are inherently dangerous, and that participation in any USEF Event involves risks and dangers including, without limitation, the potential for serious bodily injury (including broken bones, head or neck injuries), sickness and disease (including communicable diseases), trauma, pain & suffering, permanent disability, paralysis and death; loss of or damage to personal property (including my mount & equipment) arising out of the unpredictable behavior of horses; exposure to extreme conditions and circumstances; accidents involving other participants, event staff, volunteers or spectators; contact or collision with other participants and horses, natural or manmade objects; adverse weather conditions; facilities issues and premises conditions; failure of protective equipment (including helmets); inadequate safety measures; participants of varying skill levels; situations beyond the immediate control of the USEF Event organizers and competition management; and other undefined, not readily foreseeable and presently unknown risks and dangers (“Risks”).

WARNING:

Under Florida law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.

C. ASSUMPTION OF RISK: I understand that the aforementioned Risks may be caused in whole or in part or result directly or indirectly from the negligence of my own actions or inactions, the actions or inactions of others participating in the USEF Events, or the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties defined below, and I hereby voluntarily and knowingly assume all such Risks and responsibility for any damages, liabilities, losses, or expenses that I incur as a result of my participation in any USEF Events. I also agree to be responsible for any injury or damage caused by me, my horse, my employees or contractors under my direction and control at any USEF Event.

D. WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY, HOLD HARMLESS AND INDEMNITY: In conjunction with my participation in any USEF Event, I hereby release, waive and covenant not to sue, and further agree to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the following parties: USEF, USEF Recognized Affiliate Associations, the United States Olympic & Paralympic Committee (USOPC), USEF clubs, members, Event participants (including athletes/riders, coaches, trainers, judges/officials, and other personnel), the Event owner, licensee, and competition managers; the promoters, sponsors, or advertisers of any USEF Event; any charity or other beneficiary which may benefit from the USEF Event; the owners, managers, or lessors of any facilities or premises where a USEF Event may be held; and all directors, officers, employees, agents, contractors, and volunteers of any of the aforementioned parties (**Individually and Collectively, the “Released Parties” or “Event Organizers”**), with respect to any liability, claim(s), demand(s), cause(s) of action, damage(s), loss, or expense (including court costs and reasonable attorney fees) of any kind or nature (“**Liability**”) which may arise out of, result from, or relate in any way to my participation in the USEF Events, including claims for Liability caused in whole or in part by the negligent acts or omissions of the Released Parties.
